





News From the Shriners Hospital for Children-Boston

Heather's story



The following is an excerpt from a presentation Heather gave at the New England Clown College, where she was invited to speak about her experience growing up as a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston.

On October 22, 1992, I was severely burned on my left shoulder by a cup of hot coffee. I was 4 years old and I remember trying to get my mom's attention by tugging at her leg early in the morning as she was about to head off to work, and me to preschool. As she turned to me, her jacket sleeve caught on to the spoon that was in the mug and it ended up tipping over the side of the counter. The hot coffee spilled down my neck and shoulder. Even though this accident happened nearly 26 years ago, I can still remember that day vividly. My parents instantly rushed me upstairs to put me in the bath with cool water to ease the pain. The burn was so excruciating but I oddly felt at ease knowing my parents were there to help and protect me.

My parents rushed me to my pediatrician. The doctor knew it was not a good situation, but told us it can take approximately three days for a burn to declare its intensity. After the third day, my pediatrician called Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston for an urgent referral. I was admitted that day, and scheduled for the first procedure on the OR schedule the following morning with the amazing Dr. Robert Sheridan and his team. I had a third-degree burn, and they needed to replace all

of the skin on my left side of my neck and shoulder area. Dr. Sheridan used skin on my back for a graft and transferred it onto the burn with approximately 50 stitches. You can still see if you look close enough where they removed the skin, it's almost an outline of a rectangle on my back.

I was hospitalized for about three weeks. It's funny what you still remember from such a young age, especially from a life-changing event. Since I was there when it was the older hospital, all the children were in a large ward area and many in metal cribs. We each had a small TV near our beds. I quickly realized that I was not as sick or burned as the majority of the other children on the floor. My instinct was to help others as much as I could, and that also kept my mind off of what had happened to me. I went around helping turn on and off the TVs for those who could not do it themselves. I also noticed that many of the other patients there did not speak English, but we were still able to communicate our feelings towards one an-

I met a boy named Oliver during my initial stay at Shriners. He had been severely burned. When it was time to have meals, all the patients were able to get up and walk with assistance or go in a scooter, which was like a long wooden wheelchair where your legs can be extended. I would sit with Oliver at the little meal table, and clearly remember his hands being bandaged so it was very difficult for him to use them. I loved being able to help him cut up his food and eat, since I knew he was not able to do it himself. We became little buddies and bonded through our challenges.

What I recall most vividly is the care I received from the nurses, doctors and staff. They are beyond amazing, and I will forever be grateful to them. I will always remember them being so kind and reassuring that I would get better. Not only did they concentrate on my physical recovery, but they also tended to my and my family's emotional needs following the accident. I know it was difficult for my family to see me in that condition at such a young age. Without the nurses' and doctors' reassurance and attentiveness, I don't think we all could have gotten through it.

Most importantly, they did not treat me like I was different from anyone else.

They worked hard to instill a sense of normalcy for the patients. I happened to be in the hospital over Halloween. Staff found me a Little Mermaid costume and I was able to go trick-or-treating around the floor with the other patients. I actually had quite the sweet tooth when I was younger (and still do!), and I hid a lot of the candy I collected in my pillowcase so I could sneak it at night. Even though I was in the hospital and not out on Halloween like other kids my age, I still had so much fun and that was all thanks to the Shriners staff.

Upon leaving the hospital that year in early November, the staff emphasized that I get back into a normal routine. I started dancing before I was burned, and was eager to get back at it. Without dance, my entire recovery from the accident would have been different. I loved to dance, and it also helped with keeping my skin flexible while I was still growing. I danced all the way through high school and even took several classes in college. It has been an outlet for positive energy and creativity throughout my life. Dance truly has helped me cope with life's obstacles, especially my burn accident. But even still, I've had my share of insecurities and challenges over my lifetime, yet I constantly remind myself that there are so many other children and adults out there who have been burned worse than me. A scar does not define who you are as a person, it is merely just an esthetic flaw and I understand so much now about inner beauty. When I see the wonderful commercials on TV for Shriners, it brings a sense of warmth to my heart to see the patients showing how they have overcome what has happened to them, and their positive outlook on life. Since my initial operation in 1992, I have had three follow-up dermabrasions at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston. I was there when it was the old hospital, and when they broke ground for what is the current hospital. I have always looked forward to going to Shriners for check-ups. I would see Dr. Matthias Donelan, and each visit he would photograph my burn scar to see the improvement and progression for next steps in surgery. I will never forget the Barney examination table, it was my absolute favorite! I used to keep myself busy counting his spots while waiting for Dr. Donelan to come in. Drs. Donelan and Sheridan are two remarkable surgeons who have worked wonders on not only me, but many other burn patients throughout the years. I cannot thank them enough for what they have done for me. I will forever be grateful of their generosity and tremendous skills as doctors.
