
Boston Shrine Hospital News

Storms often bring power outages which in turn lead us to fall back on alternative ways to stay warm including space heaters and open fires. Even when the power remains on, we often turn to these alternatives to supplement our usual heat source.

These alternative heat sources significantly increase the risk for fires and burns, especially for children. Greetings Nobles and Ladies. As I write this, Christmas is just a couple weeks away. Lights and decorations adorn houses and businesses. Your Shrine hall is full of wonderfully decorated Christmas trees. Thousands of people will tour the hall and share in the magnificent charity that we all work to support. Your Highlanders are busy learning new tunes. Ernie is arranging a new military set and is reworking some of our other street tunes.

The band was scheduled to play for the Wreaths Across America Tour Sunday the 8th, but due to scheduling conflicts, our services were no longer needed. Ernie repurposed the time and scheduled it for practice instead. If the performance was to be outside, all the better, the pipes don't sound very good in frigid temperatures.

I was talking to Lance Trundy after the band voted to let him retire. He was telling me that the drum arrangements that your Highlanders use are genuine Scottish beatings. I've watched experts describe the consequences of these devices and the coming of 5G wireless. It is scarier than almost anything I can think of

Do what you want, but I would spend a little time researching these devices, 5G wireless, and artificial intelligence before you plug them in. I have heard people say they mentioned "swing set" in a conversation, and for the next 3 days their internet feeds featured swing set advertisements. This is just the tip of the iceberg of where the technology will be in a couple years.

Experts say, look at the company that produces the device. If their business model derives profit from "gathering information (general and consumer)" and selling it to "advertisers", then don't trust the device. We are not far from a point in time when conversations, in the privacy of your home, is listened to, and if something is said that is deemed "offensive or hate speech" the person could face immediate consequences. It would be sold on the public as protecting children or something like that. There are great dangers in a totally wired and cashless world. So, if you have one of these "listening devices", I would suggest being very careful about using it.
