



"FROM THE RECORDER'S DESK" Charlie Pray

Greetings from the Recorders Desk,

We would like to announce the opening of the Shrine Center, to experience firsthand,



We will be hosting a Virtual "Special Imperial Session" here at the temple @ 11AM on Saturday July 11th. The hall will be open to the first 50 members (In Good Standing) to contact the Recorder's office and sign up for a seat. The session is scheduled from 11:00AM until 4:00PM with an allowance for continuation on Sunday July 12th beginning at 11:00am if necessary, to complete the work. Please note: As mandated by the Maine CDC and passed down by the Governor of the State of Maine, we are limited to the first 50 members. We will be cognoscente of the 6' social distancing requirements with plans to utilize the rectangular tables with seats on either end. You will be encouraged to brink any drinks and or snacks that you might need for the day as we will not be serving refreshments during this event.

Regarding the 2021 Dues Assessment: The Divan of Anah Shrine is pleased to announce that again this year, we will not be increasing the annual membership dues to our nobility. Once again, the annual dues will be held at \$70.00 for all regular members.

The dues invoices will follow a similar schedule as last year with the assessment taking effect August 1st.

- Mid-August Email of first dues notice
- Mid-September Mailing of hard copy invoices to all members not paid by this time period
- Mid-October Mailing of the 2nd hard copy to all members not paid by this time period
- Early December Post Card mailed to all Non- Paid "At Risk of Suspension" members
- January 1st Suspension of any member 2 years in arrears
- Early February Email reminder to all non-paid members of the current dues cycle

To clarify the process, it should be noted that as of August 2020, the membership dues for the following year are assessed and will then be due. As noted. The first notice is an email version of your annual assessment. This service to the temple is the least expensive to our organization and costs pennies to expedite. Subsequent notices (Hard Copy Mailings as well as additional email versions) are extremely expensive to Anah and severely effect the overall bottom line to our temple. As you know, the US Postal Service continues to increase their rates along with printing costs and envelopes. Each follow-up contact costs the Temple a greater portion of the \$35.00 we realize out of your total \$70.00 dues payment. Therefore, we ask "If Possible", please remit the membership payment as early as you can to avoid these additional service fees from Tampa..

In closing, once again we will respectfully ask for your consideration when making your annual payment, to think about including an additional contribution to Anah Shrine. As you are all certainly aware, CoVid 19 has prohibited nearly all fundraisers for the temple, including the cancelation of our circus and numerous building rentals. This loss of revenue deeply effects the bottom line of the organization and thus, causes extreme concern with the expenditures of funds dealing with maintenance projects and the general upkeep of the facility. Your additional pledge to the temple will help us maintain the quality of the building we call home. Thank you in advance for any help that you can afford. Fraternally,

Patient Ambassador Camryn: Where is she now?


In 2018, we brought you the story of Camryn, who at the age of 11 contracted necrotizing fasciitis, a serious skin infection that kills the soft tissue. If not caught and treated quickly, necrotizing fasciitis can be fatal. After initial treatment at her local hospital, Camryn was airlifted to Massachusetts General Hospital and transferred to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston for specialized care. Under the care of Robert L. Sheridan, M.D., and his multidisciplinary team, Camryn underwent numerous surgeries and rehabilitative treatments, including daily visits to a hyperbaric chamber for oxygen therapy to help heal her wounds. A skin graft and the dedicated efforts of the hospital staff eventually allowed Camryn to return home to her family.

Camryn, now almost 16, shared her gratitude to the Boston Shriners Hospital by serving as a patient ambassador at the 40th annual Aleppo Shriners All-Star Football Classic in 2018. She also participated in the Spartan Race at Fenway Park with #TeamNoLimits that same year. We recently checked in with Camryn and her mother, Kara, to find out what they are up to these days.



I just finished my sophomore year in high school. I love sports and play volleyball and softball. My father is my coach and last year we won the Western Massachusetts Championship for softball. These days I like to binge watch TV – especially Grey's Anatomy. I also like to play basketball at home with my brother, Max (12), and sister, Molly (8).

Do you have updates to your experience as a Shriners Hospitals for Children patient since we shared your story in 2018?

I had reconstructive surgery with Dr. Dan Driscoll. I am very happy that I went through the process and with the outcome. My family and I miss having appointments – we loved seeing the staff and always enjoyed going to a new restaurant in Boston on my appointment days!

What are some of your favorite memories of the Boston Shriners Hospital?

My favorite memories are the nurses and the child life specialists. They helped me so much and were always there to make me smile. Shriners Hospital means so much to me because they helped me and so many other children.

This question is for your mom. Kara, what has your experience as a parent been like?

Shriners will always hold a special place in my heart. During our time there, the staff felt like family. I loved seeing families from all around the world being treated. Camryn was in three different hospitals. Shriners was different and so special. The entire staff is so friendly and all have a deep interest in every patient. Every patient has a unique story and experience.

How are you and your family managing during the COVID-19 pandemic?

We have taken the COVID-19 pandemic day by day. I have had a lot of online schoolwork to do, including the AP biology exam. I am disappointed that we missed softball season this year but look forward to nice weather to get outside. I look forward to spending time at the beach and with my friends this summer.

Is there anything else you wish to share?

My whole family is forever grateful for what the doctors, nurses and therapists did for me. In fact, my grandmother recently held a fundraiser for the hospital. She and friends from her condo association wanted to hold a basket raffle fundraiser to support a charity. Her friends were familiar with my story and thought it was a great idea. It turns out that within the group there was a woman who had a connection as well. She had been a patient at Massachusetts General Hospital many years ago and her doctor went on to become the chief of staff at the Boston Shriners Hospital. It was the perfect fit and all the money was donated to the hospital. This part of my life is over and I am completely healed, but I will never forget my memories of Shriners, and will always remember what I overcame.
