



participated in the Carmel Days parade. I was unable to make my work schedule cooperate to allow me to participate in this event, but I'm told that it went well. Now that the Imperial Shrine has relaxed rules for family members of Shriners to participate in "non-Shrine" events (so long as they are not in the same uniform as the Shriners), piper Lady Robyn Dulac was able to join us. After the parade, Robyn and Doug invited the band to their house for a cookout. The band is also scheduled to participate in Noble Todd Alley's memorial service on October 10, 2021.

I went to a rehearsal for a memorial service for a departed brother the other day. The brothers that were in attendance need to be commended for their work and dedication. I've learned that many, many lodges are on the verge of collapse. Many lodges consist of a small handful of brothers that are getting smaller every year. Lodges have a hard time filling the chairs for degrees. I recently had to help a brother, who lives on the other side of the state, with his E.A. lesson. They gave him his book and said see you next month. Over the phone, I went over his lesson with him. I asked if they had appointed an elder brother to help him. He said no. I said, "I'll gladly help you with anything that you need, but you need to have someone locally to help. It is best to go over it in person." I followed up a couple weeks later, and he had made arrangements to meet with a brother from that lodge. All is well, and he is enjoying his journey.

This however begs the question. What does it mean to be a MASON? In most instances, NOTHING, absolutely NOTHING. The rally cries for more members, more members, more members, more members is WRONG. Being a Mason, or a SHRINER needs to mean something FIRST. To many of us being a Shriner or Mason does mean something. Thinking about the lives that you and I help and improve on a daily basis is truly humbling. Next to the Church, the Shrine is probably the single greatest charity on the planet.

I was recently talking to a high-ranking retired member of the U.S. Military. I was told that when the officer went to a basic training camp (a few years ago), they watched the recruits step off the bus. Some of them were with it and looked snappy, and some others were just there, with the remaining in the middle. This officer was shocked to see that 20-30% of the recruits couldn't do 5 pushups. Recruits, like those, have to go to physical training for 3 weeks, at taxpayer expense, just so the military doesn't kill them during basic training. This officer was even more irritated at the number of recruits that could barely read. High School graduates no less. The officer's complaint? We shouldn't be lowering our standards.

So I ask, how many of the "new members" of any given lodge in this state can fluently read their cypher (questions, answers, opening and closing) after they complete their degrees? How many members in any given lodge, if they have a lodge brother with a business or practice, patronize that

brother? If you know of a brother that is ill, how many lodge brothers call on them or help them? I know there are hundreds of brothers and lots of lodges that make being a Mason mean something. Thank you for your service

I'm guilty of not doing what I should, are you? If your busy, work a lot of hours, have family commitments, you may not be able to take an office in lodge or participate in weekly practices. But maybe you could take a chair or give a lecture during degree work. Maybe you could be an "elder brother" to a new member. All of us doing a little, will make a big change in the meaning of Masonry and the Shrine.

If you want to help, even if you are not a Shriner or Mason, you can help this noble charity. WE NEED DRUMMBERS AND PIPERS TO START INSTRUCTION NOW, SO THAT WE WILL HAVE DEEPER RANKS NEXT SPRING, WHEN PARADE SEASON RESUMES. Our next outing is at Seasons in Bangor on the 17th. of November which will have passed when you receive this.


