



I'm writing this two days after Thanksgiving. Historically, Thanksgiving is about giving thanks to God for the blessings He has provided in the past year and the blessings He has promised for the coming year. Winston Churchill, in "The History of The English Speaking Peoples," wrote that the first governing document of the "new world" was the Mayflower Compact. Which states in part, "...by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. Having undertaken for the Glory of God, and Advancement of the Christian Faith, and the Honour of our King and Country, a Voyage to plant the first Colony in the northern Parts of Virginia..." Churchill also went on to clearly state that during that first terrible year, the Plymouth colony was a "commune". Which means that the members of the colony were to farm and work equally and to share the fruits of their labor equally.

The reason for two years of near starvation was due in large part to the people cheating the system. They didn't work as hard as they could have, and some would harvest (steal) more than their allotment. It wasn't until Governor Bradford instituted the concept of private property, in 1623, and that the settlers could keep the excess of their labors, did crop yields improved enough to allow the settlement to prosper. In any event, an interesting bit of factual history that I didn't learn in school.



The tentative dates are first week in April and First week in October. This is to accommodate safe travel for the staff and avoid conflict with graduations in May and June as well as avoiding encroaching on the circuses. 




