

Gilman N. Friend 1928 - 2010 Potentate 1976

No. 5380 Noble P.P. Gilman N. Friend of Newport was born September 23, 1928, at the family home in Newport, a son of Norris and Isabel (Cooper) Friend, he passed away December 11, 2010, at his High Street residence.. He lived out his life at his High Street home, the fourth generation of Friends and Coopers to do so.

He attended Newport Elementary School and graduated from New Hampton (N.H.) Academy. He graduated from Bowdoin College, Class of 1951. He attended Tuft's Medical School, Boston, for two years, before deciding that medicine was not for him. He wanted to be a salesman. His first job was delivering and taking orders for beer. He eventually joined

the family business, Friend and Friend, selling Ford and Mercury automobiles and managing a Mobil Oil distributorship. In 1968 he started and established the Friend and Friend Honda dealership, which is still in existence today. After becoming a licensed realtor he purchased Pine Cone Realty at the triangle in Newport. He felt fortunate to be able to walk through his hometown to his place of business, selling real estate until he was 76. He married the former Joyce Wilson of Wellesley, Mass. They raised four children together: Nathan lives in New Hampshire with his wife, Judy, and their sons, Justin, Matthew and Adam; Dana lives at Sugarloaf Mountain with his wife, Wendy, and sons, Tucker and Wilson: Tracev Moore lives in South Freeport with husband, Ron, and daughter, Lauren; and Trina lives in Boston. He married his friend Donna later in life. They had a wonderful life together traveling, cooking together, and summers spent at their Lake Wassokeag home filled with kids, cookouts and kayaks. He served many years as moderator for the town of Newport and actively served on the Newport Historical Society. He was a longtime notary public and justice of the peace, and delighted in marrying numerous couples. He served as first Chairman of the Board of Directors of Sebasticook Valley Hospital, Pittsfield, and was one of several area businessmen and women who were instrumental in the hospital's founding.

Masonically he was a 50-year member of Meridian Splendor Lodge No. 49, a life member of Royal Arch Chapter No. 28, St. John's Commandery, the Scottish Rite, Bangor and Portland, and Anah Shrines, and served as Potentate of Anah Shriners in 1976. P.P. Friend became a member of Anah Shriners on January 8, 1960.

At last the gas is in. I was afraid it would not be in before I wrote my last column. It should save us about \$2,000.00 a month in heating costs.




George now deceased and Polly Rudge of Bangor, and he and his Lady Kim (a registered nurse) have three children Brittany, Branden and Jayden.





CREATING A NEW TREATMENT FOR CLEFT LIP AND PALATE

Research in the field of lip and palate at Shriners Hospitals for Children includes the development of a new method of pre-surgical treatment for infants born with wide clefts of the lip and palate. Created by Philip Stoddard, M.D. and Beth Roscoe of Shriners Hospitals for Children – Springfield, this innovative process helps narrow the gap between the gums prior to cleft lip surgery.

From a dental impression, a plaster model of the patient's palate is made which is then scanned using a 3D laser scanner. Using CAD/CAM (computer-assisted manufacturing) a series of plate-shape corrections are digitally modeled. The corrections are designed to gradually reduce the gap, while accommodating growth. These digital models guide the manufacturing of the series of corrective appliances for the patient, using "rapid prototyping." Ideally, treatment begins with in the first month of life. Each appliance is

Ideally, treatment begins with in the first month of life. Each appliance is worn for one week, and is then exchanged for the next one in sequential order. It generally takes 10 to 15 weeks to complete the entire series. The patient then undergoes lip repair surgery. Having completed the pre-surgical treatment of the gums of the upper jaw creates a more favorable dental arch. Patients that have undergone the new procedure have had excellent results. Although long-term outcomes will not be clear until these patients are older, their progress so far is very encouraging. The new process is a time-saving, cost competitive and less invasive alternative to prior methods of pre-surgical treatment.

An excerpt from Imperial by-laws **POTENTATE'S APPOINTMENTS** TERMINATE WITH EXPIRATION **OF ILLUSTRIOUS SIR'S TERM**

For the information of uninformed members of the Nobility, when a Potentate's term of office expires, all appointments made by him during his administration terminate.

Such appointments include all appointed officers, Potentate's Aides, Ambassadors, Director of Units, members of committees and their chairmen, special appointees, Director and Assistant Directors and all members of the Potentate's Staff.

It has been called to the attention of the Potentate that some uniformed Nobles have mistakenly believed, or assumed their appointments to be permanent. **OWN APPOINTMENTS**

Not so, each Potentate, when he is installed in office as Chief Executive of a Temple of the Mystic Shrine, must make his own appointments including six officers of the Divan - 1st and 2nd Ceremonial Masters, Director, Marshal, Captain of the Guard and Outer Guard.

The Potentate has the power and authority under the Imperial Shrine law to replace every appointee, or he may, if he believes it to be in the best interest of the Temple, retain all appointees.

Traditionally, for the sake of efficiency, many Nobles of demonstrated ability are continued in office of appointments by re-appointment. But this is at the will and pleasure of the incoming Potentate. IS NOT BOUND

In no case is he, or can he be, bound by his predecessor. By the same token, in no case can any Potentate bind his successor.

In the event a Noble is not appointed for the ensuing year, he should deliver the insignia or emblem of office to the Recorder. Also, he should deliver the official Fez carrying such lettering as 'DIVAN" or any title or committee or member, with a facsimile of a scimitar, and that portion of the jewel of the staff designation to the Recorder - unless he is allowed by the incoming Potentate to keep the official Fez for sentimental reasons.

REMOVE LETTERING

If the gift Fez is worn, all lettering except the name of the Temple should be removed.

Should any Noble not holding appointment by the current Potentate wear a Fez carrying such title as "AIDE" or "AM-BASSADOR" or any other designation, he does so in violation of the Imperial Code.

Some title-happy Nobles seek to perpetuate an appointment fictitiously by adding to the letter on the Fez the year or years of appointment. This is a violation of Imperial Law. The offenders may be uninformed; but "ignorance of the law is no excuse."

For the information of all concerned, quoted in Section 116, Article XVI of the Imperial Code: "The Red Turkish Fez with Black Tassel bearing only the name of the Temple of which the Noble is an active Order consisting of the crescent, sphinx head, and star combined, embroidered thereon with gold and silver bullion or silk, is hereby adopted as the exclusive type of head covering to be worn by all Nobles of the Mystic Shrine when appearing as such. The Fez is to be worn in its proper shape and without creasing or alteration provided that is permissible for the Potentates, Past Potentates, Recorders and Divan Members, as well as official uniformed organizations to have their titles embroidered in small letters in gold or silver bullion or silk or jewels

on the front of the Fez beneath the emblem.

"It shall be permissible to adorn the name of the Temple and the emblem with rhinestone jewels of a size no larger than that known by No. 12 by the Fez makers.

"The use of any other wording or devices other than those mentioned in this Section and Article is prohibited.

This eliminates the use of titles on the Fez by any Noble or Nobles not holding an appointment by the Potentate. It also points up the fact that the use of numerals to date the years or years of service by the erstwhile appointee, making the Fez look like an obsolescent calendar, is prohibited.

A big Unit thank you to Jim Bennett for taking the helm for 2010. Thanks, Jim. He thinks he will be semi-retired but we will bug him now and again.


Merland has rounded up new digital camera cards for members. I hope they come with simple instructions for me to operate.

You know, it's getting time to think about getting the tip-ups out and trying our luck at ice fishing. I know my dog, Cookie, is waiting to get out on the ice with me.








WASHINGTON COUNTY SHRINE CL Noble Robeert Look, Reporter



His Masonic affiliations included membership in Paul Revere Masonic Lodge, Brocton MA and served as master of Paul Dean Lodge of North Easton MA. He was a member of the Mid-Coast and Waldo County Shrine Clubs. He became an associate member of Anah Shriners on June 14, 1999.

No. 8363 William C. "Bill" Taylor of Newport and Bangor was born October 25, 1917, in Berlin NH and died December 2


2010, at a Bangor hospital, after a period of failing health.
