

Our February meeting was combined with the Membership Committee before the Potentates Party and it was great to have so many Smarteam members there. Nobel Tom Woods, who is head of membership, had some interesting membership, had some interesting numbers for us from 2018. We started 2018 with 2,575 members and ended with 2,531 for a net loss of 44 for the year. We created 70 new nobles which is the most we have had since 2013 when we had 79. We lost 72 to the black camel and that is a number that we can't do anything about. We also lost 58 to membership suspensions and in the past 6 years we have lost 444 to suspensions, 461 to deaths and created 335 new nobles so as you can see the nobles we are raising are not keeping up with the nobles we are losing. In that 6 year time frame Anah has lost 17.11% of its membership. That is a trend we can't keep supporting and why it is so important to keep bringing in new nobles so we can continue to do the work that we do for the

There were 22 new nobles in January and Illustrious Sir Roger has set a goal of 100 for 2019 and it's up to you to help him with that. Time to be looking for those Masons to go into the Shrine in June.

We talked about creating a men's handbook for the new nobles much like the handbook we have for the new ladies so they have a single resource to all the units and information about the Shrine. It has worked well for the ladies and should be a great introduction to the Shrine for men as well.
