### "FROM THE RECORDER'S DESK"

Summer Greetings" from the Recorder's office.

As we continue to bath in the warmth of our summer sun, it's hard to believe that we are a few short weeks before our first membership dues notices are sent out. This year for the first time, we have an established schedule for which Tampa will be sending our annual invoices for the 2020 calendar year.

- The first communication will be an email notice, expected to be sent out Mid-August. (This is the most cost effective means to distribute the bills, so please contact the recorder to update your email address)
- Next, a "Hard Copy" of the dues notice will be mailed out Mid-September to those nobles who have not submitted payment from the first emailed notice.
- Mid-October, a second version of the mailing will take place, again, to those who have not yet submitted payment.
- Early December, a post card will be mailed to all "At-Rick" nobles who are in danger of suspension (Being more than a year behind, 2018 & 2019). The suspensions take place January 1st as result of Non-Payment.
- Early January, a "Lapsed Membership" post card will be mailed to all newly suspended members.
- Early February, an "Exit Interview" communication will be sent to all newly suspended members seeking information as to why they left and hoping to reinstate them at their earliest convenience.
- Finally, Mid-February, a hard copy mailing will take place to, once again, hopefully entice a suspended member to reinstate.

### **Boston Shrine Hospital News**

Boston Shrine Hospital Board of Governors Most Nobles and members of the Anah Shrine family know of Shriners Hospitals for Children – Boston as the only accredited pediatric burn care facility in the Northeast. You might also be aware they provide comprehensive, multidisciplinary care to children 18 and under born with a cleft lip, cleft palate or other craniofacial anomalies. You probably aren't aware however that this same team of highly skilled and dedicated professionals use their skills to treat other difficult wounds and skin disorders not caused by burn injury. This includes frostbite and other cold injuries of interest to those of us residing in Eastern and Northern Maine.

Toxic epidermal necrolysis (TEN) is another skin disorder treated at SHC-Bos. TEN is a rare skin condition usually caused by starting new medicines including antibiotics, seizure medicines, antiretrovirals, and certain NSAIDS. It can also be caused by infections and vaccinations. Those infected to lose the outer layer of skin resembling a second degree burn. Its first symptoms include fever, tiredness, cough, itchy skin, muscle aches, and sore throat. Redness, swelling, blisters and wounds then develop on the patient's lips and in their mouth. One to three days later skin lesions appear with the redness and blisters then spreading to the rest of the patient's body.

Stevens-Johnson syndrome is also treated at SHC-BOS. It is closely related to TEN having similar causes, symptoms and progression but is usually less severe.

If you happen to encounter or hear of any child experiencing any serious skin issues, please ensure their care providers are aware of SHC-BOS ability to provide the best possible care for them.





### Jimmy's story Patient becomes motivational speaker to help other burn survivors

Jimmy's story

Although Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston only treats children up until 21 years of age, we like to stay close to our patients as they grow into confident, successful adults. Jimmy is a former patient who remains closely connected to our hospital and our mission.

When Jimmy was 3, there was a fire at his home in Nicaragua. His father had gone out to buy food and his mother was working. Jimmy was home with his four siblings. They all shared a mattress on the floor. With no electricity in the house, Jimmy's sister lit a candle for light. When the children were asleep, a mosquito net covering the children's mattress caught fire and spread quickly throughout the house. Jimmy's sister Katherine rescued him from the fire, but not before he suffered extensive burns to nearly half of his body.

Jimmy's initial treatment was at a hospital in Nicaragua, where he was unconscious for many months. It was many more weeks before he was able to get out of bed to attempt walking and resume normal activities. His doctors were pleased with his recovery but knew he needed extensive reconstructive surgery to manage his scars as he grew. That type of care was not available in Nicaragua.

During his time at the hospital in Nicaragua, Jimmy met Robert L. Sheridan, M.D., assistant chief of staff and chief of the burn service at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston, who was visiting the hospital and performing surgery on burn survivors like Jimmy. Dr. Sheridan knew the team in Boston could offer Jimmy the care he needed over the remainder of his childhood. Jimmy traveled to Shriners Hospitals for

Children — Boston for the first time in 2000.

Since his first visit as a young boy, Jimmy has undergone more than 100 operations at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston. Now 22, Jimmy is working as a motivational speaker, hoping to reach fellow burn survivors and empower them during their own recoveries. He encourages them to follow their hearts and reminds them that anything is possible.
