"FROM THE RECORDER'S DESK"

Greeting's from the Recorders desk.

I would first like to thank all the nobles who gave of themselves to attend the annual Clubs and Units Seminar. Hopefully, this event is viewed as an informative gathering and sheds light on numerous activities and requests that perhaps seem tedious to those who might otherwise be a little longer in the tooth than some.

The \$99.00 question being bantered about is the status of our Temple insurance: I'm very happy to announce that as of February 19th, we have an offer pending and therefore, a deal of great stress off our backs (The policy renews April 1st of each year). As you know, the great flood of

2019 occurred back in July, some 3 months and 21 days into a new policy with a new carrier. The water damage itself, caused by a \$0.74 part resulted in a \$420,000.00 loss on a \$33,000.00 annual premium. It came as no surprise to anyone when we received the notice of Non-Renewal in late January. Since that time, we have been working to educate potential suitors of the safeguards we've implemented assuring that the potential of a re-occurrence happening has been greatly eliminated. The installation of a series of moisture alerts (Water Bugs), as well as numerous thermal indicators and electrical interruption monitors has vastly reduced the potential of something as catastrophic as last summer from ever happening again. These efforts have been looked upon very favorably by insurance providers and generally thought of as to why we have at least one offer on the table at this time.

Some other positive news regarding 1404 Broadway is that we are expecting a favorable response from the Fire Marshal of the City of Bangor for our plan to install a 36" vertical wheelchair lift which will enable mobility limited individuals access to the stage from the auditorium floor. This device is in part, the result a very generous gift from the estate of Past Potentate Harold "Hatty" Wright (Anah Potentate 1980). The unit is expected to be installed in the southwest corner of the building next to the mechanical room which will enable wheelchair users the ability to gain access to the stage thru the left double doors and onto the upper level of the auditorium. Many thanks to the family of PP Wright. In closing, thank you to all nobles who have taken care of their annual dues invoices, it's much appreciated.

February 15th was our 5th annual comedy night thank you for everyone's support and help a good time was had by all.

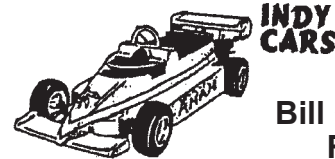
