

This Nobel was born in 1964 at Lewiston, Maine and lived in Poland Springs until he was two years old. His father was tragically killed in an industrial accident when he was just a year old. As fate would have it his mother moved back north where she was from, eventually remarried and they picked up life and moved on. He grew up in a small-town Northwest of Presque Isle and developed a strong work ethic on the surrounding farms picking potatoes, rocks, milking cows and having in the summer. Walked to school uphill, barefoot, both ways in the driving snow (not really, but that is what he told his kids.) His mother was a well-known cook in the area and passed on her skills to her son, who went on to keep expanding his experience as a cook then manager at Bonanza and the Northeastland Hotel. Two days after high school graduation he boarded a plane for the very first time and flew to Fort Sill, Oklahoma to start his journey in basic training and advanced training as a 13-Bravo, Redleg, Gun Bunny artillery soldier. He served for 11 years in the Maine Army National Guard, 152nd Field Artillery unit out of Presque Isle.

Little did he know then that their paths would cross again 20 years later in the Shrine. He started in the fire

service in 1984 and continues today transitioning from a volunteer to a career firefighter/paramedic, Fire Chief, and now back to a volunteer again. His Lady has asked him several times to have his head examined but there is no hope of recovery.

His Masonic journey started in 2003 when he was initiated in Pioneer Lodge #72 at Ashland. He was raised to the sublime degree of a master mason In April 2004. He jumped in with both feet and worked his way through the chairs being elected Master in 2011, where he remained until 2013. In 2014 he was appointed District Deputy Grand Master of the 1st Masonic District, serving until 2016. He currently serves as Junior Warden of Pioneer Lodge and Assistant Grand Lecturer for the 1st and 24h Districts. He is a member of the Valley of Aroostook Scottish Rite, Garfield Chapter York Rite and sits a Warder for Crown and Cross Commandery #25 in Presque Isle.

His Shrine journey began in Mars Hill in 2006 trekking across the original "Hot Sands" and coming out the other side honored to be welcomed by Illustrious, Richard 'Dick" Hallet and many wonderful nobles. He was welcomed with open arms into the County Klown unit and with the help of many fine mentors, became "Sprinkler", sometimes also referred to as "Tikki" after a minor mishap with some flammable liquids. He went on to be the Boss Klown or better know as "sucker" or "cat wrangler" and may have caused a few kids here and there to smile or laugh like the time when he took a blow-up hammer to "Jeb" which folded him in half. He is a life member of the Aroostook Shrine Club, serving as cook, bottle washer, and eventually club president for the last two years.
