

Over the upcoming weekend of January 15th & 16th, we will bestow the title of Illustrious Sir upon the next leader to govern our Shrine Temple. In a peaceful transition of power, Noble Galen C. 2022 will mark the beginning of the 100th time our beloved fraternity has embarked upon the annual tradition of bringing in a new Potentate. Special Dispensation to form Anah Shrine was granted on June 16, 1921. This date marked the birth of our Shrine Temple as we know it and gave our nobility the sovereign opportunity to govern ourselves accordingly and began the separation from the directives of Kora Shriners. (Kora Shrine was granted dispensation 3 decades earlier on December 14, 1891) Finally, the Charter for Anah Shrine was approved on June 15th the following year (1922). The division of the State of Maine into two separate Shrine Centers marked the first time in 30 years that the nobility of the State of Maine had two Individual fraternal organizations. While over the years the divisionary lines have changed slightly, the basic boundaries remain mostly in tack as they were drawn up one hundred years ago.

Thank you to all the nobles who took part in the December "Stated Meeting" and especially for participating in the annual election of officers. Along with the elections, the approval of the 2022 temple budget is a major responsibility of the nobility and integral part of your shrine center. While it takes a tremendous amount of work from your Divan members to arrive at a balanced budget, the final approval is up to you, the nobility. Thank you all for your commitment and dedication to work thru the details and arrive at the bottom line.

Once again, I wish you a very safe, happy & prosperous New Year! Let's make 2022 another great year for Anah Shrine!






We would have gotten together at my home for a pot luck and yankee swap. I'm sure we had a great time and all have continued to stay well.



In 1972 Tom opened the first branch for Brake Service and Parts in Presque Isle. In 1972/1973 he served in various capacities for Brake Service Presque Isle and Bangor including district sales representative, warehouse manager and sales manager. In 1983 he moved to Boston to establish the heavy duty division of New England Wheel and Rim. In 1984 he moved back to Presque Isle and together with his family they opened Clukey's Auto Supply stores operating in Presque Isle, Caribou and Houlton.

Tom was very active and community minded and was always ready to help where he was needed.

Tom was involved as a member and past president of Walker Siding Snowmobile Club, former Director and member of the Fairfield Chamber of Commerce and a 2 year member of Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks in Presque Isle. Tom was a mason and member of Trinity Lodge. He was a member and past director in 2011 of ROJ court of Bangor. 


