Illustrious Noble C. Ivan Huntley Is Elected Anah's 31st Potentate

Now that Illustrious Potentate C. Ivan Huntley, of Old Town, has risen through the Divan ranks of Anah Temple to attain the highest station in Temple officialdom, it's a logical sequence that the Anahgram should want to give the Nobility a little data about our new chief and furnish a close-up view of the man who, as Anah's 31st Potentate, will lead us through the new year of our Mystic Shrine affairs.

Illustrious Potentate Huntley was born July 3, 1897 in Machias. He was educated in the Machias public schools, graduating from the Machias High School in 1915 and from the Washington State Normal School in Machias in 1917, continuing in summer courses at the University of Maine. Following his graduation he taught mathematics at the Madawaska Training School in Fort Kent for three years; was sub-principal at the Brownville Junction High School for one year and principal of the Mexico Junior High School for one year. He later became associated with the Jordan Lumber Co., of Old Town and has continued with this concern up to the present time, serving now as plant manager of the company and also of its affiliate, the Jordan Casket Co.

Always interested in community affairs, Illustrious Noble Huntley has been a close follower of civic matters. He is chairman of the city's board of assessors, now serving his third term. He is a past president of the Old Town Rotary Club, past president of the Old Town Young Men's Christian Association, a trustee of the Old Town Methodist Church and past president of the Old Town Methodist Men's

Club. Ever since the organization of the Bangor Chapter of DeMolay he has served as a member of the advisory council.

Illustrious Noble Huntley's Masonic interests began in Harwood Lodge, No. 91, F. & A. M., of Machias, where he was raised a Master Mason April 4, 1921. He affiliated with Star in the East Lodge, No. 60, F. & A. M., of Old Town in 1923, and is a Past Master of this lodge. He is also a member and Past High Priest of Old Town R. A. Chapter, Order of High Priesthood, Maine Council, Bangor York Rite Council, St. John's Commandery, K. T., of Bangor, Tamerlane Conclave, Knights of the Red Cross of Constantine, and Bangor Court No. 150, R. O. J. His enrollment as a Noble of Anah Temple is dated May 24, 1929—and the fact that he served for 14 years as a member of Anah's Arab Patrol is good evidence that he has long been a worker for our Temple.

On July 27, 1921 Illustrious Noble Huntley married Miss Ruth Jordan, of Old Town. They have two daughters—Mrs. Edith Merrill, of Baltimore, Md., and Mrs. Marion Sirois, of Orono—and a son, Kenneth A. Huntley, now serving in the United States Navy.

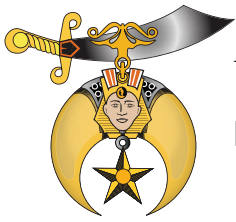
