POTENTATES MESSAGE Adam Beals, Petentate

Well summer has finally arrived, and the parading season is in full swing - The Divan appreciates all the hard work you put in during the summer! It has come to our attention that some motorized units have been parading without helmets. Remember - This is still a requirement; helmets must be worn during all parades. I know it's not what we like to wear, and your fez would be better, but with the issues we have had with maintaining insurance over the years, this is required to keep in compliance. Thanks for the help!

A group of us just got back from Imperial in Reno, Nevada. It was a busy week, many meetings and lots of networking. We have been notified

that Imperial has accepted our bylaw This change goes into effect Dec 31, 2024. The change we proposed was suspension of nobles after ONE YEAR of unpaid dues versus three years. Our rational for this change is cash flow, for every year these nobles are in the arears, Anah still has to pay Imperial per capita. With nobles three years in the rear this costs Anah upwards of \$15,000. We decided that we can no longer carry that bill for so long. This is going to be a huge change and all nobles need to be aware, so please pay your dues timely. Some of you may not know that if you don't pay your 2024 dues - you cannot participate in any Shrine activities, this includes Circus, Parades, or club/unit meetings. Right now, we are looking at about 200 members that will be suspended at the end of the year. If you haven't paid your dues * Please, Please, * Please * contact the office to pay your dues or visit Web Fez for payment ASAP. I sent letters out the last week to all members that need to pay dues, be sure to call us with any question.

This past weekend, we had the East-West Lobster Bowl. If you have never been to this event try to make it out to next year! All the athletes work very hard to get donations for Shriner's Childrens. While at

Imperial Session, we learned that Maine Lobster Bowl was ranked #2 in all of the Shriner's International for our 2023 Maine Shrine Lobster Bowl - \$180,000 raised. This past weekend, they raised \$206,000 in 103 days - all I can say is WOW! One football player in Orono raised almost \$7400 and was the top contributor! The football game was very well attended at Lewiston High School, the stands and sidelines were packed with people. What a game it was - the West came out on top with a score of 48-18. Be on the lookout next year for the details and make it a point to attend.

This coming Sunday some Divan members and Shrine membership leaders will join with leaders from the appendant Masonic bodies to discuss membership - how we can help each other? The Grand Master and I talked while in Reno. we determined it would be a good idea to get all involved in one room to discuss a plan forward. The best thing we can do to support our Blue Lodges is going to meetings! If you have been thinking about going and haven't, make it a priority to go next month to support your Brothers.






Reading past years Anahgram reports, there sure are some interesting stories that we've all shared with our Shrine family. What a great organization and I'm proud to be a part of it!

MEET PAIGE AND GRAYSON





Every year, Shriners Children's™ selects a pair of International Patient Ambassadors to represent the healthcare system's patients. The ambassadors share their stories of perseverance and the ways Shriners Children's has made a difference in their lives. We are honored to have these impressive young people advocating for our healthcare system.

PAIGE

Paige, 19, is a college student from Louisiana studying business management. When she was 8, Paige experienced a terrifying allergic reaction to a newly prescribed seizure medication. At first, doctors thought she had developed strep throat, and some even thought it was pinkeye, a common childhood ailment. When her symptoms drastically progressed, she was rushed to the hospital with a 104 degree fever and her skin slowly blistering off her body.

Her diagnosis was Stevens-Johnson syndrome (SJS), a painful and rare condition often described as burning from the inside out. With the worst form of SJS, toxic epidermal necrolysis (TEN), Paige had developed a life-threatening rash that eventually covered 80% of her body and mimicked the effects of a severe burn injury. Doctors knew her best chance of survival was to transfer her to Shriners Children's Texas.

The burn care teams at Shriners Children's have the specialized expertise to treat conditions such as SJS using many of the same burn care standards and treatments for skin conditions that have characteristics similar to burns.

Over the years, Paige has had over 20 surgeries, with much of her early teen years spent going in and out of the hospital for treatment. Today, she experiences the lingering effects of SJS, including issues with her vision. But this hasn't stopped her from accomplishing her goals and enjoying her life. Not only are her parents and two younger brothers a constant source of strength (and laughter!), but her care team has become like a second family to Paige.

Paige became a patient ambassador for Shriners Children's Texas, a role that helped her strengthen her determination to succeed and gives her a platform to spread awareness about SJS. She is dedicated to helping children facing similar battles, including the bullying from peers that often accompanies these types of conditions. Her experiences have honed her leadership skills.

"To me being a leader means that you have the will, the want, and the power to make a difference," said Paige. The hardest thing she has done in her life was accepting what happened to her and looking at it in a positive light: But she had the courage and perseverance to get through it and come out stronger on the other side.

Paige looks forward to sharing her story on an even bigger stage as an International Patient Ambassador. "Without Shriners Children's, I would definitely not be where I am today. In fact, I probably would not be alive," she said.

"I am very excited about the chance to give back and talk about the life-saving care I received at Shiners Children's. I want to inspire others and give hope that they too can endure."

GRAYSON

Grayson, 20, was born in Kiev, Ukraine, without a femur, making his right leg significantly shorter than his left. He was also born missing two fingers on his left hand. At 15 months, he met his parents while living in an orphanage in Ukraine. His mom and dad were ready to adopt and aware that Grayson would need specialized medical care.

Grayson's mom, Ceci, knew who to call. She reached out to a contact at the Pediatric Orthotic and Prosthetic Services (POPS) department at Shriners Children's Lexington for help.

When Grayson arrived in the U.S. with his parents, they weighed their options for treatment with the medical team in Lexington. They decided on surgery to remove part of the foot and rework his ankle to suit a prosthetic leg.

Today, thanks to some help from his care team and a lot of personal perseverance, Grayson never lets his physical differences hold him back. He has tried everything from swimming to football, soccer, basketball, baseball and crosscountry running. He's been active in 4-H and enjoys shooting sports. Grayson is an Eagle Scout and enjoys rock climbing, hiking, bicycling and skiing.

"Shriners Children's Lexington has been a part of my life from the very beginning," Grayson said. "Shriners Children's has literally given me the legs to be my fullest self. I am forever grateful for everything they have done for me."

Grayson's parents agree. Ceci said the medical center has always made it easy for Grayson to get the care he needs, especially remaining accessible at any time to make adjustments to his prosthetics for comfort, fit and function. "We're so thankful for Shriners Children's, because we've been able to get above and beyond what Grayson needs. The quality of the care and the quality of the providers far surpass anywhere else," she said.

Grayson credits his parents and his care team for instilling in him the confidence to never put limits on himself just because of his physical differences. He strives to be the kind of leader who is humble, kind and generous even when people aren't watching.


Orayson grew up in Kentucky with his parents, brother and sister and is now attending college in Arkansas. He is majoring in construction science, with dreams of being a real estate developer.


